

Summer Reading Instructions

Students should report the first day of school ready to discuss the required book(s) appropriate to their grade. Students accepted/enrolled after August 1st may be given an extension to complete the required reading.

Extra credit will be given for up to a total of three (3) English selections and/two (2) social studies selections from the list for each grade. When school begins, students will set up appointments for informal oral reports on extra credit selections. Each extra credit selection will be counted toward one of the student's semester grades.

***Students are on their honor not to select works they have studied in any class or works on which they have made reports in the past.**

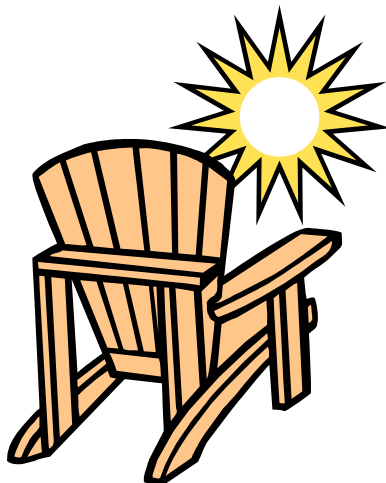
